#035 IS TRANSITIONAL MANAGEMENT AMONG THE SOLUTIONS DURING THE CRISIS PERIOD?

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Lack of resources also impacts the managerial side of companies. Using **transition firms specializing in Supply Chain** is an option that should be seriously considered.

They are able to find available profiles (operations managers, site managers, agency managers, etc.) in their network in a single day. These **specific profiles**, most often senior managers, will be needed to handle peak loads, implement “back-up” solutions and finally manage the resumption of activity in warehouses and traffic.



The immediate or progressive integration of these interim managers will depend on the activity, their profile and their ability to be quickly operational by taking on the specific challenges of the company's transport and logistics activities.

The use of this type of operational framework can be an effective way of freeing up "knowledgeable" internal teams to focus on priority management and the overall short and medium-term steering of supply chains.

The challenge is not to paralyse essential supply chains such as those in the agri-food or health sectors through a lack of anticipation of resource needs.
